THE FIRST READING

Acts 11.1-18

Read by Janet Bell

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

¹Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. ²So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, ³saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?' ⁴Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, ⁵'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. ⁶As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. ⁷I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat." ⁸But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth." ⁹But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." ¹⁰This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. ¹¹At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. ¹²The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³He told us how he had seen the angel standing in

his house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; ¹⁴he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved." ¹⁵And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. ¹⁶And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." ¹⁷If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?' ¹⁸When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.'



PRAY WITH US

THE WORLD The US has condemned the killing of a citizen, an Al Jazeera journalist, by Israeli forces, describing it as an atrocity from the viewpoint of the international community, and calling for an independent investigation to honour her with accountability. We pray that all deaths which result from violence and conflict might have their legacy given this recognition. In Ukraine, 560 of the Ukraine National Guard have died in the conflict, and a captured Russian soldier is to stand trial for war crimes, while Russia continues to push for complete control of Mariupol, and the world gives thanks that civilians have been released from that city. We pray for reconciliation and peace in Nigeria where for the past the years various armed groups have wrought terror to the lives of citizens. Again, seven soldiers have been killed in an ambush while on patrol in the country's northeast. In the DR Congo's eastern Ituri Province, dozens have been killed and many more are missing following an armed raid at a mining encampment. Such unprovoked attacks are daily hazards, and our prayers for people there and in many other situations where daily life continues to be uncertain, must be regular and unceasing. Two-thirds of Malawian children are unable to complete their primary education, because they are unable to pay levies to sit for exams in a 'free' education system. An encouraging story of hope tells us of a teacher who accepts underprivileged children who have dropped out of school, caring for them with her own salary, later supported by village chiefs and others, although often the children are eating only twice a day. We thank God for knowing of this selfless teacher, for the success of her endeavours, and for highlighting to the affluent west the needs, not just for peace, in small and poor countries.

OUR CITY & STATE With confirmation that the Commonwealth Games of 2026 will be held in Melbourne and four regional hubs, it will be a significant and much-needed boost to businesses and tourism in Melbourne and Victoria. Following the success of the F1 Grand Prix, the plans to host further international sporting events give a great opportunity.
