THE NICENE CREED

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church:

God of all truth, we pray for your church, your ministers and your people. Guide and strengthen Justin, Archbishop of Canterbury, Geoff our primate, Philip our Archbishop, and Andreas our Dean, that their leadership might be according to your will. For our Province, we pray for the Diocese of Wangaratta, Bishop Clarence Bester, the clergy and people. In our diocese we pray for City on a Hill Mt Duneed, St Mark's Emerald, All Saints' Clayton and All Saints' Mitcham. Enable us all to live as faithful disciples and effective light for your glory.

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

God of all love and compassion, we pray for all who are in trouble, pain or distress: for those overwhelmed with the burdens of life; those who are ignored, looked down on, or pushed to the fringes, for all who are bereaved and who feel lonely or abandoned. Comfort and heal, we pray, all who are in sorrow, need, sickness or any other trouble. Give to those who care for them wisdom, patience and gentleness, and to us all your peace.






THE POST-COMMUNION PRAYER

PRAY WITH US

FOR THE WORLD – FOCUS ON THE AMERICAS We continue to pray for all people caught up in the war between Israel and Palestine. In the US, we ask God to bring peace and thoughtfulness to those concerned for family members, as an open letter from a civil rights group urges colleges and universities to respect free speech, particularly for those rallying on behalf of Palestinian rights. We ask God's enabling for rescue plans and comfort for those who have lost loved ones and property in hurricane Otis which hit Mexico last week. We pray for Brazilian President Lula da Silva in his aim to integrate countries of South America by encouraging concentration on their common interests and putting aside their differences. Our care for creation notes findings of mercury contamination from gold mining being found in tropical wildlife from Central and South America and the West Indies.
